

**Dr. Henry Small**  
**Director of Corporate Research**



Dr. Henry Small is the director of Corporate Research for Thomson Scientific. Dr. Small received a joint Ph.D. in Chemistry and the History of Science from the University of Wisconsin. After a brief career as a historian of science at the American Institute of Physics' Center for History and Philosophy of Physics, he joined ISI<sup>®</sup> (now part of Thomson Scientific) in 1972.

His 1973 paper published in the *Journal of the American Society for Information Science (JASIS)* on co-citation in the scientific literature led to numerous papers on citation analysis and the mapping of science. He has served on the JASIS editorial board since 1986 and is a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS). In 1987, Dr. Small received the JASIS Best Paper Award and the Derek de Solla Price Medal from the journal "Scientometrics." In 1998, he received the Award of Merit from the American Society for Information Science & Technology (ASIST)—the highest honor the Association Bestows on individuals.

In 2001, Dr. Small was named Chief Scientist of the formerly-named ISI in recognition of his contribution to the organization and for his work in the area of developing and applying co-citation analysis, which has resulted in a better understanding of the structure, relationships, and evolution of the sciences. That same year, Dr. Small was named an Honorary Fellow of the National Federation of Abstracting and Information Services (NFAIS).

Dr. Small's most recent accomplishment occurred last year when he was named president of the International Society for Scientometrics and Infometrics (ISSI). The announcement was made at the organization's ninth annual conference held in Beijing. Typically, ISSI office holders are selected by the Board. This marked the first time elections were held, allowing the approximately 100 members representing over 25 countries to cast their vote as well.
