4. Find the SIDs of suppliers who supply a red part or a green part.
5. For each part, find the name of the supplier who charges the most for that part.
6. What's the minimum price of all green parts?
7. Find sailors with better rating than sailor 'jones'
8. Find the age of the youngest sailor who is eligible to vote for each rating level that has less than two sailors

9. Find the age of the youngest sailor who is eligible to vote for each rating level that has less than two sailors [and that doesn't have any sailors over 60.

The following questions use the classicmodels database.

1. Create a view that shows all employees who work in France
2. Create a view that shows all employees who work in the USA
3. Query the view to show all employees who work in the Boston office
4. Find all customers for each employee.
5. Find all orders for each customer.
6. Find all customers where their names start with D
7. Find all customers who are not located in the USA.
