Internetworks in International Development

International Internetworks

- Offered first in Summer of 1995
- Taught simultaneously with the University of Jos
- Correspondence students from three continents
- Providing students with first-hand, unmediated interactions with cohorts in developing countries
- Expanding the classroom beyond our campus

Fulbright Year – 1999/2000

- University of Jos, Plateau State, Nigeria
- Teaching about computers and networking
- ICT internship program
- Interviewing university administrators throughout the country
- Saw a need for a coach/advocate



WiderNet

- Since 2000, building capacity at African institutions for academic collaborations
- 10,000+ participants from 27 universities in Nigeria, Ghana, East Africa, and India (~40% women)
- Collected over \$2,500,000 in new & used hardware, software. Refurbished and shipped 1,600+ used computers for partner universities in Africa
- Volunteers have put in over 80,000 hours
- Focus on practical, cost effective solutions
- Helping to build a digital culture (best practices, user groups, student internships, gender equity...)

A'A Curbyour Enthusiasm

Half of the people in the world do NOT have access to the Internet. Half of the people who can access the Internet have slow, unreliable, and expensive connections.

A 50/50 Proposition

- The Internet is 50 years old
- 50% of people in the world have access
- 50% of those who are connected find it expensive and slow
- The easy networking's been done
- We need new, affordable solutions to serve the poor

Offline Web

Two phenomena:

- Information, born digital or digitized, more affordable and sustainable
- Interconnected local area networks (Internet) makes it easier to broadly deliver digitized information
- A powerful marriage of technologies.
- Offline schemes utilize digitized information over local area networks. Same concept, but limited to a narrow range.

It's All About the Data

- Tracking various sources of content
- Tracking publishers and permissions
