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# Development

- Kenney and McGovern, co-developers at Cornell University
- Funding from U.S. National Endowment for the Humanities for 3 phases
- Twelve 5-day workshops (2003-2006)
- Phase 3 relocates workshop to Michigan and extends curriculum (2008-2010)
- Tutorial launched in 2003 (winner of SAA 2004 Preservation Publication Award)
- Ten off-site workshops (2005-2009)



#### Audience

- Target audience: managers responsible for digital preservation programs
- Participants: more than 500 participants from 200 institutions in 20 countries
- Represents: institutions of all types, sizes, and sectors
- Includes: individuals at varying levels of experience and expertise

#### Collaborative Curriculum

Phase Three (2008-2010) coordinating with:

- Ongoing NAA and DPTP programs



#### Collaborative Curriculum

- Developing "workshop-in-a-box" approach
- Adopting Virginia Tech/UNC template for documenting curriculum modules
- Pursuing almost open source approach to developing curriculum
- Comparing train-the-trainer options to extend instructor base
- Coordinating with potential US and international partners
